Explore 'cold colours'. Use a range of these in a collage, carefully choosing your art and materials.

### I like designing:

Design a pair of snow boots for an Arctic explorer. What materials would you use and why? What features could they have? Let your imagination run wild!

Design your own Arctic and Antarctic word search puzzles using all the new words you have learned during the topic. Challenge a grown-up to solve it!

### I like researching:

Research facts about the Titanic. Use the internet and video clips to learn about the disastrous consequences of its maiden voyage. Where was the ship built, launched from and heading to?
